Overview

This course provides participants with an understanding of and ability to navigate through the difficult aspects of dealing with campus emergencies involving natural or manmade events, including acts of violence. The course consists of small, problem-based, integrated group activities that require a coordinated, integrated approach to solve. Through tabletop scenarios, course participants will observe a developing incident and respond in a manner consistent with currently established campus and jurisdictional emergency operations procedures.

Scope

This class is designed to address campus emergencies associated with a planned event or spontaneous incident requiring the attention of personnel from PK-12 schools and IHEs, first responders, elected officials, and community stakeholders.

Target Audience

This class is designed for campus leaders who may be involved in planning for, responding to, and recovering from campus emergencies. Suggested attendees are personnel from PK-12 schools and IHEs, first responders, elected officials, and community stakeholders whose responsibilities include, but are not limited to the following:

- Campus administration
- Campus public safety
- Student affairs
- · Jurisdictional public safety
- Faculty governance
- Facilities
- Campus health services
- Student governance
- Emergency management
- Campus public affairs and public information
