# OH606: RECOVERY FROM DISASTER WORKSHOP

<u>Course Description</u>: This course provides representatives of county / local emergency management, local governments (township, municipalities, county, special district, authorities, etc.), certain private non-profit organizations, and organized volunteer organizations with an overview of pre- and post-event topics related to disaster recovery. Training modules include the damage assessment process; declaration process; an overview of the various supplemental State and Federal Disaster Assistance Programs; and the need for and organization of long-term recovery groups.

Recommended Participants: The primary participants for this class include the county Emergency Management, local governments (Townships, Villages and Cities), CERT, ARES, schools, authorities and special districts, certain private non-profit organizations, organized local damage assessment teams and organized volunteer organizations.
